Beechfield School are celebrating VE Day by asking children and parents to take part in their own VE Day celebrations at home.

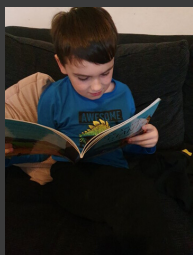
We thought this was a great idea and again a lovely example of how we can all still connect with each other at this time.

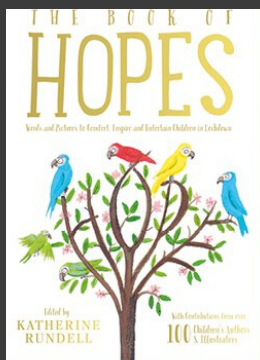
BOOK CORNER
